
#### A New Intern for Adult Spiritual Development

Among the many things that the Holy Spirit has been doing at Willow Glen lately, she has brought Yin Mei Lawrence to us as our new "intern" for Adult Spiritual Development. We have not had someone dedicated to this ministry since Ingrid Quigley left that part-time position on our church staff in 2011. To help us get to know her, here is a bit about her background and her passion for ministry:



Yin Mei is our new penguin – don't worry, if it doesn't make sense, ask someone who was there that Sunday morning when she shared from the pulpit her background and why she's here in our church. Yin Mei comes from a teaching background, she taught chemistry at the College of San Mateo for the last 16 years but is now a full time "God-seeker". She does this formally through classes with Fuller Seminary and the Renovar é Institute, but really through participation in congregational life. She's a member of the Campbell Church of Christ but will be here at WGUMC "as often as possible" as the Intern in Adult Spiritual Development. In her own words, her love language is food, her spiritual gift is eating, her ministry is "togetherness", as in "eating together, praying together, working together, weeping together, celebrating together". She's particularly interested in spiritual healing, growth and renewal and would love to get to know us individually and as a church family. We welcome Yin Mei as a member of the Body of Christ and our new companion in faith at Willow Glen.


#### **Financial Update**



There is good news and not so good news on the church financial front. First, the good news - we have almost completed our large unexpected projects and as a result of some memorial funds and other special giving it looks like we have weathered the storm without impacting our operating budget. With regard to our ongoing operations we still have a slightly positive cash flow, however, we have had to use all of our reserves for the year to keep even, so we are definitely going to need some extra giving before the year is out. We will keep you updated on our financial situation during these last few months of the year. In the meantime, please make sure your pledge is up to date and if you have the ability to give a little extra this fall we could really use the help. #### Stewardship



Have you ever wondered how much of a difference your financial commitments really make to our ministry? Unlike many UMC's, Willow Glen does not sustain itself on rental income because we use our buildings for our own ministry. That's a good thing! That's a sign of life and health. But it means that more than most, we are a member-supported church. We need to raise about \$350,000 each year from pledges and other giving. With a membership of around 300 and less than 100 families, you get an idea of what a challenge it is and how remarkable it is that we have managed to meet that challenge year after year. God is good!

This year, we have incurred a number of unbudgeted expenses. Grappling with a large number of employees and changing labor laws, we hired a payroll service. We also hired a CPA to help us with some accounting upgrades. We renovated the Willowmont parsonage and are fixing up the Woodhaven apartment, in addition to replacing the sanctuary lift. We also are continuing to raise salaries to meet the state minimum requirements for our full-time youth directors. All of these expenses align with our ministry priorities, but they have increased the strain on our church budget. So, we ask that you support all the new things that are happening and new opportunities that are opening and, if you possibly can, increase your financial support of your church family. In the coming weeks, you will be receiving a stewardship book that describes all of our ministries and the many ways you can support them. But you don't have to wait for the book. You can increase your giving at any time. Go to our website, wgumc.org, or ask our financial secretary, Ingrid Quigley, for instructions in how to give.

#### Village House Day Shelter Wrap-Up

We would like to thank all those who volunteered to provide day shelter for the Village
House women four days a week during the month of September. The women were
grateful to have a place to rest and recuperate away from the street and the heat. We
especially thank our day shelter director, Mindy George, and our shift supervisors: Jim and
Jan Leonard, Liz Pense, Amy Yee, Gerri Hodson, Sherri Raia, Yin Mei Lawrence, and Leslie Chamberlain.

If you ever wonder why we put so much time and effort into this ministry, listen to Mindy's story: "The most memorable experience for me was when one of the guests received a phone call letting her know she had lost her job. She had recently become sober and she told me that she really wanted to just leave Woodhaven and go get drunk. Instead, she came into the dining room to talk to me. We had a nice long chat, sharing our stories, struggles and current journey. Then she told me, "you know, I don't feel like drinking anymore". That's exactly why I work at Village House. I want to be there to serve and share with another soul that needs it. And-it completely takes me out of myself, my problems, etc."

#### **Getting Ready for Lift-Off**

The company that sold us the lift is here installing it today, October 1st. If everything goes smoothly, we should be fully functional by October 13th, and we will try to be patient if we have to wait until the week after. It will be so wonderful to have those who have been watching the worship service from our "satellite campus" in the church library join us in the sanctuary for a dedication ceremony celebration. We want to be ready to party after we get the OK from the contractor and Trustees. If you can bake a cake, blow up balloons, and help us put on a big wonderful party, please contact Pastor Rebecca or Pastor Susan. We will send out an all-church bulletin as the date is confirmed and plans are developed.

#### **Pastoral Letter**

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? [Isaiah 43:19]



Our "Isaiah 43:19" group that includes pastors and lay people from AHUMC, CPUMC and WGUMC met with our district superintendent on September 22nd. Mariellen Yoshino, pastor at AHUMC, made some charts of different models for cooperative ministry, and we took a straw vote on which model the group members thought that we should be working toward.

We then heard from Luke Hamm who is the pastor at Church of the Wayfarer in Carmel and Monterey about how those two churches are going about forming a cooperative parish. In meeting together, they discovered a critical need for more preschools in their community. So now lay people from Carmel are providing the leadership to start a Methodist preschool on the campus of Monterey UMC with an intentional outreach to the families of those preschool children.

After asking Luke a lot of questions, our group decided to draft a covenant for our three churches that would provide us with a process for discerning whether or not to form a cooperative parish and what that would mean beyond what we are already doing cooperatively through the Joint Youth Ministry and Mexico Mission. This covenant will be presented to our three churches at our church conferences this fall.

If the covenant is adopted, we will begin in earnest and meet frequently to explore options and deepen relationships that already exist between our three churches. On the strength and quality of those relationships, we would then build a strategic plan for how to do new ministry together and, God willing, support the creation of a new church of young adults in San Jose.

In the meantime, Susan Smith has offered to reach out to the young adults who are graduates of our JYM program or connected to our churches and are still in the area. In the next several weeks, we will be gathering them to listen to their stories and to listen for their spiritual needs and ask them about their dreams of what church could be.

This next year promises to be very exciting and there are so many opportunities to be a part of something that could be incredibly life-giving. I pray that you will feel the Holy Spirit nudging you to offer your spiritual gifts for God's great work among us in the months ahead


