All seventh and eighth-graders (and any high schoolers who have not yet been confirmed) are invited to join our Joint Youth Confirmation class which will regularly meet one evening per week (March through April). Confirmation Sunday will be celebrated in May.

As part of the confirmation experience, Lisa, Kat and I ask that each youth find a mentor. This should be a member of the church (preferably not a family member) who is willing to spend some time sharing with a teen about his or her faith and church experience. Mentors will be expected to join us for two or three classes, stand up with their teens when they are confirmed, and spend several hours with the teens outside of class talking about various faith-related issues. Pastoral Letter

Sisters and brothers in Christ, grace and peace to all of you.

The year 2020 makes me think of the eyesight I have lost and the insight that we are all going to need as we give and live for God at Willow Glen this year. Last year, the folks on Trustees, Finance and SPRC were hard at work on several infrastructure projects. We contracted with a payroll service to help us better comply with new labor laws. We hired an outside accountant to streamline our books and an IT specialist to upgrade our computer network and secure our data.

While those projects are not easily seen, the renovation of the Willowmont parsonage and Woodhaven apartment and replacement of the sanctuary lift are a different story. These improvement projects were all costly, and we thank you for your generous contributions. We also got an on-bill financing loan from PG&E to replace all of our old lighting with energy-efficient LED lights.

Now that we can literally see better, our Vision Team took the time to survey the congregation to discover what areas of ministry we may have been overlooking and where we need to train our focus in the year ahead. Along with the building upgrades, we are due for some Body upgrades, so in 2020 we will concentrate on ways that we can deepen connections and strengthen community life here at Willow Glen.

That's why we thank God for Curt Moore and his calling to start a new men's ministry on Tuesday evenings. "The Heart of Men" kicked off in January with a barbecue, and he is inviting all men to join him on an adventure to rediscover what it means to be a man of faith and to reclaim a sense of purpose for one's life and one's relationships.

We give thanks for the opportunities to connect with other believers, but we are also grateful for our deepening connections with our sister churches in Almaden and Cambrian Park. In November we voted to go forward with plans to create a cooperative parish and to support a new young adult church in the South Bay and we have now sent a draft of that proposal to the Bishop and Cabinet and await their response.

In a time of rapid cultural and climate change, our churches are realizing that we have to change, too. So, as wonderful as it is to have 2020 hindsight, we are praying for 2020 foresight as we flesh out our cooperative parish proposal in the months ahead. Though change can be unsettling, it is also exciting. And we are ready to embrace it because we know that God is good. All the time!



If you think so, too, we invite you to come along to see some new sights and experience new birth. You can do that by renewing your commitment to support in any way you can what God is doing at WGUMC. Look for the stewardship book that will come to you (I promise!) in the month ahead and take the time to read through the pages about

all the ways that you can love God and neighbor through your church. Then have each member of your family fill out a commitment form and return it to the church in the envelope provided.

Bishop Carcaño Statement on UMC Protocol of Reconciliation & Grace Through Separation

A Word from Bishop Minerva G Carcano – January 3, 2020

Friends,

Grace and peace to you in this New Year. May Christ our Lord bless you and keep you throughout the days to come.

Early this morning the work of a group of faithful leaders of our United Methodist Church pertaining to the division that we continue to

experience over whether LGBTQ+ persons will be fully included in the life and ministry of The UMC was released. While it is not solely the work of the Council of Bishops, it is work that has had the full support and engagement of the Council.

Just yesterday the Council of Bishops held a conference call at which time we received an updated report on what is being called the Protocol of Reconciliation & Grace Through Separation. While a conference call of 90 bishops connecting from places around the world can be difficult, the response was hopeful and thankful to God for a process that has been done carefully, respectfully and lovingly.

The Protocol is the work of a diverse group of United Methodist bishops and other leaders from across the connection which allows for traditionalist churches to form a new denomination while preserving The United Methodist Church. It also calls for holding in abeyance all administrative or judicial processes addressing restrictions in the Book of Discipline related to self-avowed practicing homosexuals or same-sex weddings beginning January 1, 2020. The authors of the Protocol referred to this abeyance as "...one expression of reconciliation and grace through separation..."

Approval of the Protocol would also initiate the process of organizing the US jurisdictions into a region alongside regional bodies in Africa, Europe, Eurasia, and the Philippines with flexibility to adapt the Book of Discipline to enable each region to better serve in their social contexts. Provisions for continued funding to eliminate racism within the UMC and support for racial-ethnic ministries is another integral and critical piece of the Protocol. You can find the full press release by journalist Sam Hodges at <u>UMNews.org</u>

I want to ask that all of us take time to prayerfully consider the Protocol document and pray for our General Conference delegation and all the delegates who will gather in Minneapolis in May for the 2020 General Conference of The United Methodist Church. May they too be Spirit-led as they consider the work before our beloved Church. I strongly believe that this Protocol document deepens our work of Christian conferencing on the matter of the full inclusion of ALL God's Children. May it bring us healing as we work together in God's mission for the transformation of the world.
